**Description**

I am using Kubuntu. lsb\_release -a shows:

Distributor ID: Ubuntu  
Description: Ubuntu 12.04.1 LTS  
Release: 12.04  
Codename: precise

I have two monitors. One is a 37inch HDTV. The other a lcd monitor. I have finally gotten the anti-alias settings so the fonts aren't horribly ugly system wide. I have RGB sub-pixel rendering enabled with full Hinting style and nothing in the Exclude range.

I run the Quassel IRC client primarily on the lcd monitor. I would like the chat text to be slightly larger. If I Enable the Custom chat +w+indow font: I can change the text size. Doing so seems to cause Quassel to ignore the system wide anti aliasing settings. The result is the text looks horrid.

Is there a way to force anti aliasing when using a custom font? Maybe this is a feature request instead of a bug. However, as it isn't working as I hoped, I'm going for bug.
